

First Nations COVID-19 testing in Ontario: Weekly report 68

Key messages:

- New positive results **remained low at 19** as of August 2, 2021 (compared to 21 last week). The number of positive results among First Nations to date is 4,874.
- Increases in new results in any area were all less than 1%.
- With the exception of a possible uptick in Ontario test volumes, all other measures are holding steady this week: test volumes in First Nations, positivity, hospitalization and death rates in First Nations and across Ontario.

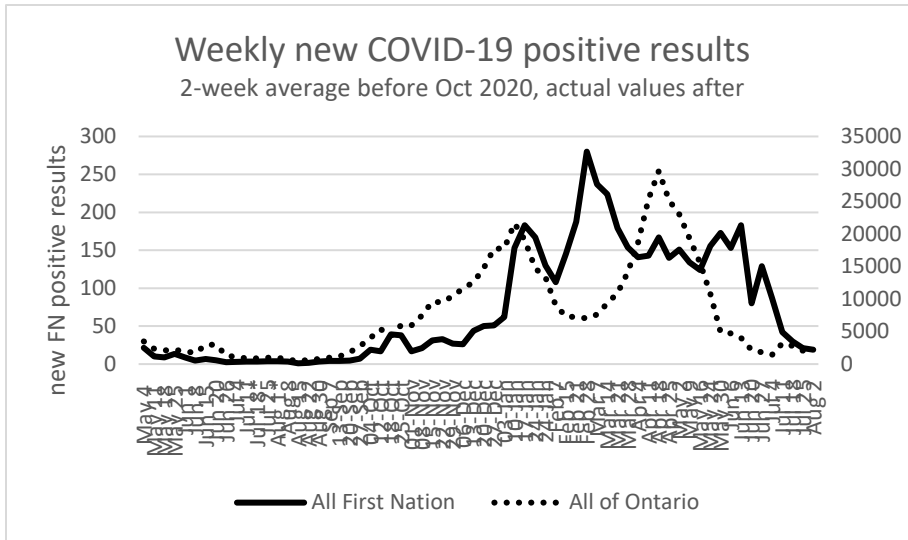

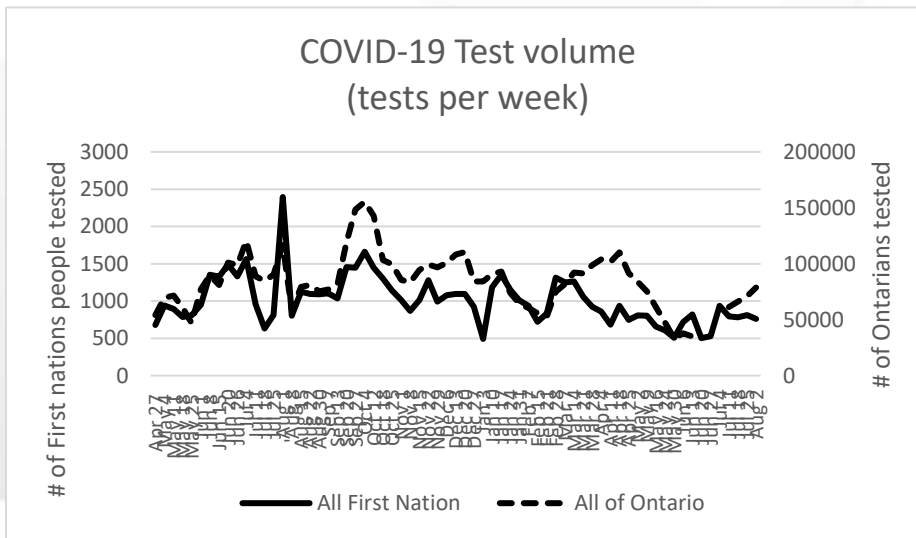

Databases reflected in this report: As of July 18, 2020, the data sources for this report have expanded beyond the original Ontario Laboratory Information System to include data from the Public Health Information System (IPHIS), Distributed Labs (DL), and Public Health Ontario Laboratory (PHOL) databases. The sources are the same for First Nations and Ontario statistics.

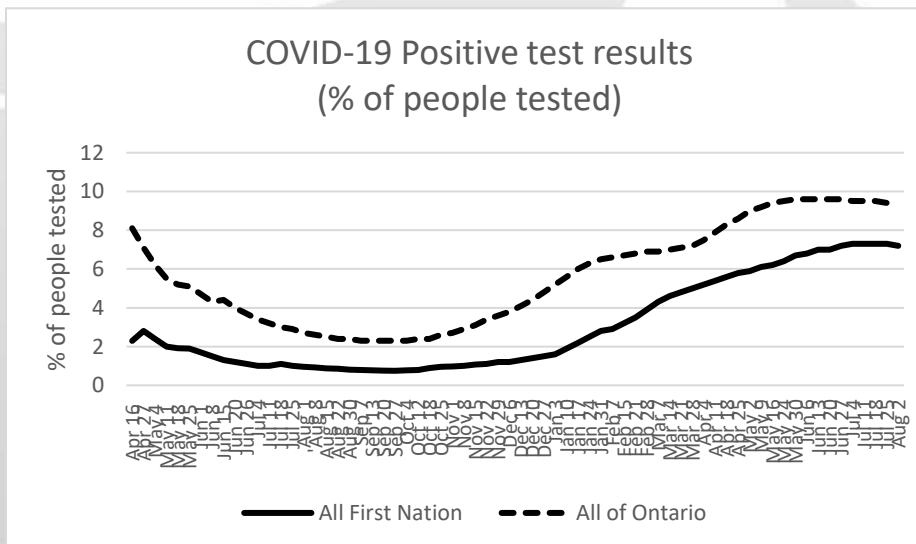
COVID-19 Test results over time



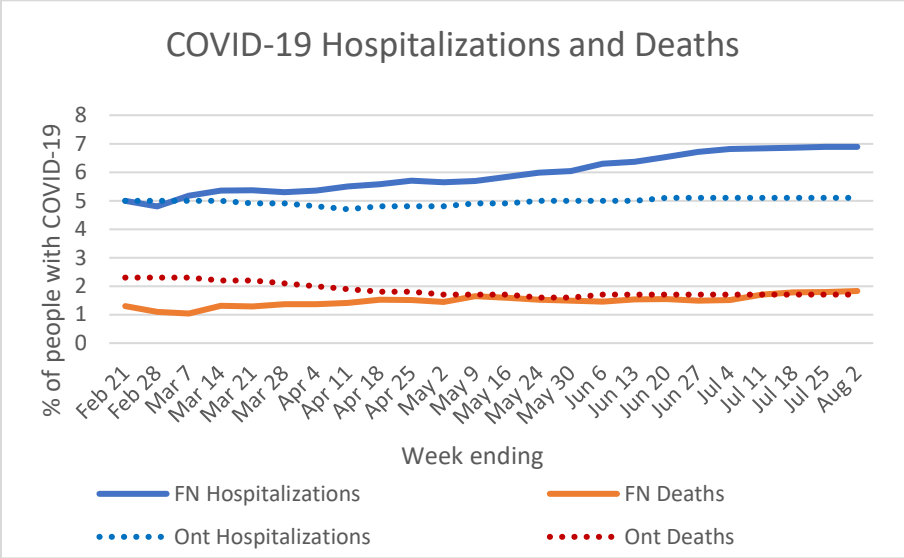
New COVID-19 positive test results **remained low** this week. Ontario numbers remained low too.



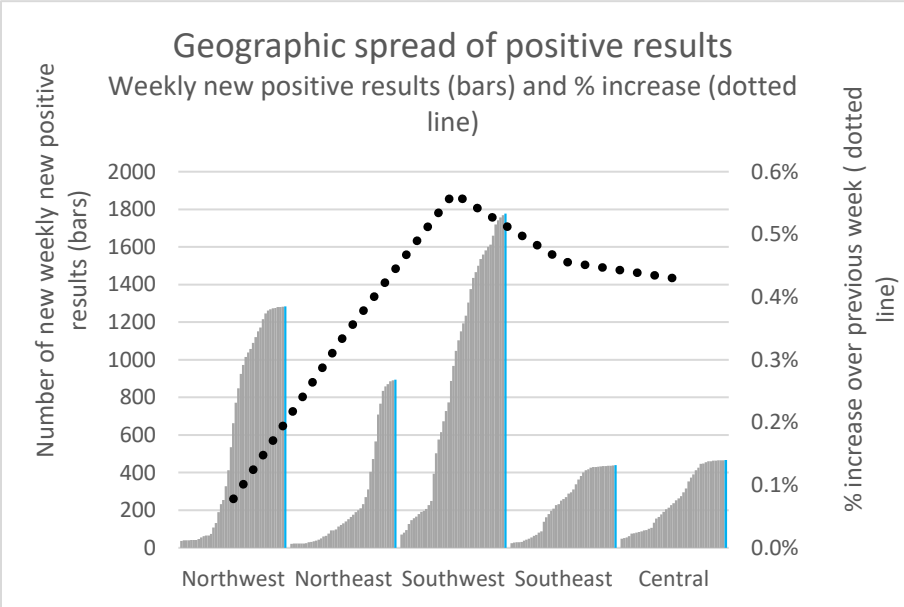
Test volumes among First Nations were within normal variation this week, with what appears to be a continuing increase in Ontario test volumes.



The cumulative positivity rate is holding steady across Ontario and in First Nations.



The rate of hospitalizations and deaths among First Nations and across Ontario remain steady.



The increases from last week were very small (less than 1%) across all areas. Blue bars show numbers of new cases in most recent period, with previous weeks in grey. The areas are based on boundaries of Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs). See appendix for details.

Appendix:

Data source: Characteristics of COVID-19 diagnostic test recipients among the Ontario First Nations population, ICES. Ontario hospitalization and death rates accessed from the [Ontario COVID-19 Data Tool](#).

Intervals in the reported data: Data are as of the week ending on the date shown with the exception of June 20, Jun 26 and Jul 4 for which data for First Nations are for the previous 5, 6 and 8 days, respectively, due to changes in reporting period. Data for Ontario and First Nations for week ending Aug 30, Sep 7, Sep 13, Oct 12, Oct 18, Feb 15, Feb 21, May 24 and May 30, 2021 are for 8, 8, 6, 8, 6, 8, 6, 8 and 6 days respectively (with weekly test volume prorated to 7-day rate).

Weekly new positive results: Prior to Oct 2020, each week's total is the average of the current and previous week to mask values of less than 5, in compliance with data suppression rules. After that, actual numbers were used because the volume of new results per week was consistently (and unfortunately) more than 5. Data for Jul 18 and Aug 1 are based on averages of the previous and following weeks of both dates, to correct for known data quality issues.

Boundaries of "areas": Test results of individuals are reported for the LHIN associated with the postal code on the individual's Ontario health card. LHINs included in each "area" for this report are: Northwest: LHIN 14; Northeast: LHIN 13; Southwest: LHINs 1-4; Southeast: LHINs 9-11; Central: LHINs 5-8, 12. Follow this [link](#) to view maps showing LHIN boundaries.

Suppressed data: Data suppression is done at ICES. When data for one category in a series are suppressed, at least one of the results based on these categories must also be suppressed. Hence totals greater than 5 may be suppressed for one or more areas when at least one of the LHINs included in the calculation of area totals has less than 5 cases.
